

CHECKLIST OF THE BIRDS OF WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK

Two hundred and twenty-nine species of birds have been recorded in and near Wells Gray Park since records were first kept in 1950. The following list provides details of status and abundance for each of these species, based on occurrence in six representative areas. Records of any additional or otherwise unusual sightings will be gratefully received by Trevor Goward: trevor.goward@ibotany.ubc.ca.

STATUS:

P – Permanent Resident

S – Summer Visitor

W – Winter Visitor

T – Transient (i.e., present only during migration)

A – Accidental (i.e., out of normal range)

I – Irregular (i.e., abundance varies from year to year)

* - Known to breed locally

(-) - Period of lesser abundance

ABUNDANCE:

C – Common (more than 10 birds [or flocks] per day)

U – Uncommon (at least 1 bird [or flock] per day)

R – Rare (fewer than 1 bird per day)

V – Very Rare (fewer than 5 birds per year)

A – Accidental and casual (not occurring every year)

LOCALITIES:

MALK – Mahood Lake, 630 m elevation

ROAD – Park Road: Spahats Ck to Park entrance, 700 m

CLLK – Clearwater and Azure Lakes, 680 m

RAYF – Ray Farm – Horseshoe – Alice Lake, 700 m

MULK – Murtle Lake, 1000 m

MTNS – Battle and Trophy Mountains, 1500-2500 m

PLEASE NOTE:

Abundance units are based on the number of individuals or (in the case of gregarious species) flocks an experienced birdwatcher, in appropriate habitat, might expect to see during the season of that species' greatest abundance.

DEDICATION:

The period 1950 to 1963 were the halcyon days of bird study in Wells Gray Park. During that period it is safe to say the park received considerably more attention from bird enthusiasts than it does today. We dedicate this checklist to the following "pioneers" of Wells Gray birdwatching: Douglas Dow, Yorke Edwards, Fay Hartman, Bob and Hettie Miller, and Ralph and Clara Ritcey.
